**TITLE:** Business & Industry

**WHERE:** online via <http://firstsearch.oclc.org/fsip?dbname=BusIndustry&done=referer>

**What's important:** Contains fulltext and some excerpts of articles from international and U.S. business magazines and trade news. It's typically the best place after S&P *Industry Surveys* to quantify how big an industry is and projections and trends. It is esp. good with smaller industry segments and emerging industries.

**Example:** Type your industry name, and you can use words like forecasts, trends, sales, market size and market share to get at particular types of information. Tell the database you want that type of info by changing the box from "keyword" to "descriptor." This is a more powerful business intelligence search.

**Abstract:** Mobile robot sales may total \$17+ bil by 2005, vs \$665 mil in 2000, according to ActivMedia Research. About 11,000 service robots are expected to be installed in Japan by 2002, of which 65% will be placed in hospitals and nursing homes, according to the Japan Robot Assn. Healthcare robots could be a \$1 bil market by 2010, vs a \$250 mil market by 2005. Honda Motor is developing Asimo, a small mobile android that can carry out various jobs. The robot is being installed with programs and artificial sensors enabling it to be autonomous. Honda in fall 2001 intends to begin renting Asimo to firms and museums for use as a visitors guide for an unrevealed amount. Detail is given to other matters pertaining to artificial intelligence robots.
